### **MISSION STATEMENT**

The mission of the Volunteers in Policing (VIP) Program is to contribute to public safety and to law enforcement-community relationships by assisting the Santa Barbara Police Department in a variety of non-enforcement capacities that promote the community-oriented policing philosophy of the department.



## SELECTION PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS

## Potential members of the VIP Program must meet the following criteria:

- At least 21 years old and possess a valid CA Driver's License.
- A resident of Santa Barbara or nearby communities.
- Pass a detailed background check.
- Attend bi-monthly meetings.
- Able to volunteer an average of 16 hours per month or 48 hours quarterly.
- The ability to communicate clearly with police personnel (on radio) and the public.

For applications and further information, contact *hgiles@sbpd.com* or 805/698-2673. There are several steps in the application process. Potential VIPs must initially complete an extensive personal history questionnaire. Eligible applicants will be invited to an interview, followed by a thorough background investigation. The entire process often takes 3-4 months to complete.

### **VIPS' WORK ROLES**

VIPs regularly walk and patrol State Street, Stearns Wharf and other locations interacting with citizens and tourists, assisting in traffic control, and protecting the integrity of crime scenes. Some VIPs assist the public in the SBPD lobby as Greeters. VIPs often help with crowd control at parades and public events and we have our own assigned vehicle to be mobile on patrol.

VIPs with appropriate experience, have also worked with the SBPD in areas, including but not restricted to:

- elder abuse
- criminal investigations
- actors in police training exercises
- created 'at risk ID cards for vulnerable populations
- training officers to testify more effectively in court.
